


ORDERED that:


1. By Order dated March 1, 1996, in Misc. Docket No. 96-9078 (as amended by Misc. Docket No. 96-9226), the Supreme Court of Texas ordered that “all lawyers licensed in the State of Texas on or after July 1, 1996, are required to take the course entitled *A Guide to the Basics of Law Practice*, sponsored by The Texas Center for Legal Ethics and Professionalism.”
2. During his distinguished Court service and as a member of The Texas Center for Legal Ethics and Professionalism, Justice James A. Baker embodied the highest standards of ethical and professional conduct, both in and out of the courtroom, and championed the teaching of legal ethics and professionalism to Texas lawyers.
3. To honor his contributions to Texas law practice and to The Texas Center for Legal Ethics and Professionalism, the Supreme Court of Texas hereby renames the required course for newly licensed Texas lawyers the *Justice James A. Baker Guide to the Basics of Law Practice*, and all steps appropriate to accomplish that result shall be immediately undertaken.


