
**ORDER ACCEPTING RESIGNATION IN LIEU OF REVOCATION PROCEEDINGS**

Dear Justice Cornyn:

The Board recently sent notice to Tom De Paul regarding a hearing on the issue of whether the Board should recommend that the Court revoke Mr. De Paul's Probationary License, based on his violation of several conditions of the license. At the conclusion of Mr. De Paul's testimony on Saturday, January 15, 1994, Mr. De Paul submitted a copy of a letter of resignation which he had already delivered to the State Bar Membership Department (copy enclosed).

Since the Board regarded Mr. De Paul's offer of resignation as making further proceedings moot, the Board did not go forward with deliberating as to whether to recommend revocation Mr. De Paul's probationary license. Instead, the Board directed me to forward to the Court a copy of Mr. De Paul's resignation letter, along with the enclosed order for the Court's signature, accepting Mr. De Paul's resignation in lieu of further revocation proceedings.
