
VOLUNTARY RESIGNATION OF TOM A. CONNALLY


ORDER



The Court, being advised that such resignation is not tendered in lieu of disciplinary action, hereby concludes that the following order is appropriate.




RE: Voluntary Resignation of Tom Connally enclosed.

Attached is a signed copy of Tom Connally's request for voluntary resignation from the State Bar of Texas.


