

DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, J. Bradley Nance, (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Dallas County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at 11325 Pegasus, Suite E157, Dallas, Texas 75238.

III.

On or about May 24, 1994, Complainant employed Respondent to handle a family law matter. Complainant wanted to be named as the managing conservator of his daughter. On or about June 20, 1994, Respondent filed a Motion to Modify. In March, 1995, a mediation was conducted in the case and an agreement was reached between the parties. Thereafter, Respondent failed to prepare and submit an order to the court reflecting the terms of the mediation agreement. Additionally, Respondent failed to file a Motion for Contempt despite Complainant's requests that Respondent file such a Motion due to his ex-wife's failure to comply with the terms of the temporary orders.

IV.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraphs III, IV and V, hereinabove, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rule 1.01(b)(1) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

V.

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Michael Morris filing a complaint on or about November 18, 1997.

PRAYER



As a practical matter, I would respectfully suggest that you inquire with the judge to be appointed as to: (1) whether he or she will be able to comply with the 180 day deadline by which the case must be set for trial set forth in Section 3.07 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure; and (2) whether he or she can accommodate compliance with *Mellon Service Co., et al v. Touche Ross Co.*, 946 S.W.2d 862 (Tex. App. - Houston [14th Dist.] 1997), which requires that all proceedings incident to a case occur in the county of proper venue. If not, I would respectfully request that an alternate appointment be made.


