COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS

Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1987

The Court of Criminal Appeals is the highest state court for criminal appeals and is composed of a Presiding Judge and eight judges. Additionally, pursuant to Sec. 22.106 of the Texas Government Code, special commissioners may be designated to aid and assist the court as needed.

Until September 1, 1981, the Court of Criminal Appeals received all criminal cases appealed from the district and county-level trial courts of the State. On that date, a constitutional amendment and implementing legislation became effective which conferred on the 14 Courts of Appeals intermediate appellate jurisdiction in all criminal cases except those in which the death penalty was assessed. Appeal of death penalty cases remains direct to the Court of Criminal Appeals.

Decisions of the Courts of Appeals in criminal cases may be appealed to the Court of Criminal Appeals by petition for discretionary review, filed either by the State, or the defendant, or both. In addition, the Court may review a decision on its own motion.

Matters Added to the Docket

During the state fiscal year 1987 which ended August 31, 1987, there was a total of 586 cases added to the docket of the Court of Criminal Appeals. Two hundred and one of these were cases where discretionary review was granted by the Court and 213 were direct appeals, death penalty appeals, writs of habeas corpus granted, and extraordinary writs. Death penalty appeals in fiscal 1987 numbered 52, compared to 35 in fiscal 1986.


The 586 cases added in fiscal year 1987 represent an increase of 64.6 percent from the 356 cases added during fiscal year 1986, which ended August 31, 1986.

In addition to the cases added:

(1) The Court had 1,339 petitions for discretionary review filed during fiscal 1987, 21 fewer than the number filed during the previous year. Petitions for discretionary review were

received from 135 counties during 1987, with 46 percent of them originating from Harris or Dallas Counties;

- (2) There were 2,231 applications for writs of habeas corpus filed during fiscal 1987 (a 7.5 percent increase over the 2,074 filed in fiscal 1986); and
- (3) 1,653 other motions or applications were handled by the Court (a 38.6 percent increase over the 1,193 considered the previous year).

Rate of Dispositions Decreases

During fiscal year 1987, the Court disposed of 443 cases considered on their merits, compared to 409 such dispositions in fiscal 1986. In 1987 those 443 dispositions represented 42.5 percent of all cases on the docket (that is, cases filed during the year or carried over from previous years). In fiscal 1986, this disposition rate was 47 percent.

In fiscal 1987, 1,672 petitions for discretionary review were disposed of, 342 (or 20.05 percent) of which were granted and the remainder were refused or dismissed. In fiscal 1986, 1,100 petitions for discretionary review were disposed of, 201 (or 18 percent) of which were granted.

There were 2,242 applications for writs of habeas corpus disposed of in fiscal 1987, compared to 1,809 in 1986, an increase of 24 percent.

Judges of the Court of Criminal Appeals wrote 647 opinions during fiscal 1987, 435 (67 per cent) of which were "deciding" opinions which disposed of cases. The remainder were dissents, concurrences, and opinions on rehearing. Of the deciding opinions, 221 were signed and 214 were per curiam. During 1986, members of the Court wrote 663 opinions, 70 percent of which were deciding opinions.

Total Pending Caseload Increases

On August 31, 1987, there were 2,168 total matters (excluding miscellaneous motions and applications) pending in the Court. This represented a decrease of 8 percent over the 2,369 matters pending on September 1, 1986.

On August 31, 1987, there were pending 370 granted discretionary review cases, 806 applications for writs of habeas corpus, 765 petitions for discretionary review, and 227 direct appeals, death penalty appeals, granted habeas corpus writs, and extraordinary writs.
