Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1990

The Court of Criminal Appeals is the highest State court for criminal appeals and is composed of a Presiding Judge and eight judges. Additionally, pursuant to Section 22.106 of the Texas Government Code, special commissioners may be designated to aid and assist the court as needed.

Until September 1, 1981, the Court of Criminal Appeals received all criminal cases appealed from the district and county-level trial courts of the State. On that date, a constitutional amendment and implementing legislation became effective

which conferred on the 14 Courts of Appeals intermediate appellate jurisdiction in all criminal cases except those in which the death penalty was assessed. Appeal of death penalty cases remains direct to the Court of Criminal Appeals.


Decisions of the Courts of Appeals in criminal cases may be appealed to the Court of Criminal Appeals by petition for discretionary review, filed either by the State, or the defendant, or both. In addition, the Court may review a decision on its own motion.

MATTERS ADDED TO THE DOCKET

During the State fiscal year 1990 which ended August 31, 1990, 405 cases were added to the docket of the Court of Criminal Appeals, of which 202 were cases where discretionary review was granted by the Court and 203 were direct appeals, death penalty appeals, writs of habeas corpus granted, and extraordinary writs. Death penalty

appeals in fiscal year 1990 numbered 42, compared to 33 in fiscal year 1989.

The 405 cases added in fiscal year 1990 represent a decrease of 42 percent from the 696 cases added during fiscal year 1989.





OTHER MATTERS ADDED

The Court had 1,380 petitions for discretionary review filed during fiscal year 1990, 412 less than the number filed during the previous year. Petitions for discretionary review were received from 125 counties, with 48 percent of them originating from Harris or Dallas Counties.

Applications for writs of habeas corpus filed during the year totalled 2,078, a 30 percent decrease from the 2,985 filed in fiscal year 1989. Also, 1,824 other motions or applications were handled by the Court, a 7 percent decrease from the 1,955 considered the previous year.



RATE OF DISPOSITIONS INCREASES

During fiscal year 1990, the Court disposed of 202 cases on direct appeal, compared to 525 such dispositions in fiscal year 1989. In 1990, those 202 dispositions represented 48 percent of all cases on the docket on direct appeal, that is, cases filed during the year or carried over from previous years. In fiscal year 1989, this disposition rate was 69 percent.

In fiscal year 1990, 1,352 petitions for discretionary review were disposed, 202 (or 15 percent) of which were granted. The remainder were refused or dismissed. In fiscal year 1989, 2,107 petitions for discretionary review were disposed, 246 (or 12 percent) of which were granted.

There were 2,285 applications for writs of habeas corpus disposed in fiscal year 1990, compared to 3,281 in 1989, a decrease of 30 percent.

Judges of the Court of Criminal Appeals wrote 561 opinions during fiscal year 1990, of which 440 (76 percent) were "deciding" opinions disposing of cases. The remainder were dissents, concurrences, and opinions on rehearings. Of the deciding opinions, 170 were signed and 270 were per curiam. During 1989, members of the Court wrote 1,133 opinions, 87 percent of which were deciding opinions.

TOTAL PENDING CASELOAD DECREASES

On August 31, 1990, 1,278 total matters (excluding miscellaneous motions and applications) were pending in the Court of Criminal Appeals. This represented a decrease of 21 percent from the 1,615 matters pending on August 31, 1989.

Of these 1,278 matters, 224 were direct appeals, death penalty appeals, granted habeas corpus writs, and extraordinary writs, 270 were granted discretionary review cases, 466 were petitions for discretionary review, and 318 were applications for writs of habeas corpus
