#### Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1991

The Court of Criminal Appeals is the highest State court for criminal appeals and is composed of a Presiding Judge and eight judges. Additionally, pursuant to Section 22.106 of the Texas Government Code, special commissioners may be designated to aid and assist the court as needed.

Until September 1, 1981, the Court of Criminal Appeals received all criminal cases appealed from the district and county-level trial courts of the State. On that date, a constitutional amendment and implementing legislation became effective

which conferred on the 14 Courts of Appeals intermediate appellate jurisdiction in all criminal cases except those in which the death penalty was assessed. Appeal of death penalty cases remains direct to the Court of Criminal Appeals.


Decisions of the Courts of Appeals in criminal cases may be appealed to the Court of Criminal Appeals by petition for discretionary review, filed either by the State, or the defendant, or both. In addition, the Court may review a decision on its own motion.

#### MATTERS ADDED TO THE DOCKET

During the State fiscal year 1991 which ended August 31, 1991, 386 cases were added to the docket of the Court of Criminal Appeals, of which 210 were cases where discretionary review was granted by the Court and 176 were direct appeals, death penalty appeals, writs of habeas corpus granted, and extraordinary writs. Death penalty

appeals in fiscal year 1991 numbered 39, compared to 42 in fiscal year 1990.

The 386 cases added in fiscal year 1991 represent a decrease of 4.7 percent from the 405 cases added during fiscal year 1990.




\*1984 and following are fiscal years; all previous are calendar years.

#### OTHER MATTERS ADDED

The Court had 1,340 petitions for discretionary review filed during fiscal year 1991, 40 less than the number filed during the previous year. Petitions for discretionary review were received from 137 counties, with 48 percent of them originating from Harris or Dallas Counties.

Applications for writs of habeas corpus filed during the year totalled 2,013, a 3.1 percent decrease from the 2,078 filed in fiscal year 1990. Also, 1,462 other motions or applications were handled by the Court, a 20 percent decrease from the 1,824 considered the previous year.



#### RATE OF DISPOSITIONS INCREASES

During fiscal year 1991, the Court disposed of 154 cases on direct appeal, compared to 202 such dispositions in fiscal year 1990. In 1991, those 154 dispositions represented 38.5 percent of all cases on the docket on direct appeal, that is, cases filed during the year or carried over from previous years. In fiscal year 1990, this disposition rate was 48 percent.

In fiscal year 1991, 1,382 petitions for discretionary review were disposed, 210 (or 15 percent) of which were granted. The remainder were refused or dismissed. In fiscal year 1990, 1,382 petitions for discretionary review were disposed, 202 (or 15 percent) of which were granted.

There were 2,119 applications for writs of habeas corpus disposed in fiscal year 1991, compared to 2,285 in 1990, a decrease of 7.3 percent.

Judges of the Court of Criminal Appeals wrote 592 opinions during fiscal year 1991, of which 439 (74 percent) were "deciding" opinions disposing of cases. The remainder were dissents, concurrences, and opinions on rehearings. Of the deciding opinions, 201 were signed and 238 were per curiam. During 1990, members of the Court wrote 561 opinions, 78 percent of which were deciding opinions.

#### **TOTAL PENDING CASELOAD DECREASES**

On August 31, 1991, 1,202 total matters (excluding miscellaneous motions and applications) were pending in the Court of Criminal Appeals. This represented a decrease of 5.9 percent from the 1,278 matters pending on August 31, 1990.

Of these 1,202 matters, 246 were direct appeals, death penalty appeals, granted habeas corpus writs, and extraordinary writs, 279 were granted discretionary review cases, 465 were petitions for discretionary review, and 212 were applications for writs of habeas corpus
