

# COURTS OF APPEALS

## Analysis of 1983 Activity

There are 14 Courts of Appeals in Texas which, since September 1, 1981, have heard intermediate appeals in both civil and criminal cases. Five of the courts have three justices each. The others range in size up to the Dallas Court, with 13 justices.

There were a total of 79 justices on the Courts of Appeals at the beginning of 1983. One more was added to the Fort Worth Court on September 1, for a total at the end of the year of 80 justices statewide.

### Growth of Criminal Backlog Controlled

The growth of the backlog of criminal appeals in Texas, which reached crisis proportions from 1974 to 1980, was brought under control by the Courts of Appeals during 1983.

From 1974 to 1980--when original criminal appeals were heard exclusively by the single Court of Criminal Appeals in Austin--the backlog had grown annually by an average of 45 percent per

year.

During 1982, the first full year in which the intermediate Courts of Appeals had jurisdiction over criminal cases, the pending criminal case backlog in those courts increased by only 7.1 percent and in 1983, pending criminal cases decreased 21.2 percent.

The Courts of Appeals had 4,423 criminal cases and 2,393 civil cases pending as of January 1, 1983. On December 31, 3,518 criminal cases and 2,574 civil cases were pending.

These 14 courts disposed of 8,038 total cases during 1983, an average of 102 dispositions (64 criminal and 38 civil) per justice. A total of 7,314 cases were added to the dockets of the Courts of Appeals during the year, which included 4,132 criminal cases and 3,182 civil cases. This was a decrease of 4 percent from the 7,611 total cases added in 1982. However, while criminal cases added decreased 12 percent from the 4,691 filed in 1982, civil cases increased 9 percent over the 2,920 filed in 1982.

1983




One measure of the success of the Courts of Appeals in handling criminal cases is their record in disposing of cases transferred to them by the Court of Criminal Appeals.

When the Courts of Appeals first began exercising criminal jurisdiction on September 1, 1981--as the result of a constitutional amendment--the Court of Criminal Appeals transferred 1,637 pending criminal cases from its docket to the various Courts of Appeals.

Of the 1,637 cases transferred, all but 3 had been disposed of by the end of 1983.

Two of the Courts of Appeals are located in Houston. One each is located in Fort Worth, Austin, San Antonio, Dallas, Texarkana, Amarillo, El Paso, Beaumont, Waco, Eastland, Tyler and Corpus Christi. Each court has jurisdiction over a supreme judicial district.

#### Filings Averaged 88 Per Justice

Considering civil and criminal cases together, the Ninth Court in Beaumont had the highest average number of new cases filed per justice

(115) during 1983. The other courts ranged down to 51 cases per justice filed in the Sixth Court in Texarkana. State average filings were 88 per justice.

The Eleventh Court of Appeals in Eastland disposed of the largest number of cases per justice (115) during 1983. State average dispositions were 100.5 per justice.

The largest number of pending cases per justice at the end of the year (99) was in the Ninth Court of Appeals in Beaumont. The lowest number was in the Eleventh Court in Eastland (40 per justice). The State average for pending cases was 76 per justice.

Approximately 24 percent of all cases filed in a Court of Appeals in Texas in 1983 were filed in one of the two Courts located in Houston. Approximately 21 percent of all cases filed in the State were filed in the Dallas Court.

In 1983, justices of the Courts of Appeals wrote 7,613 opinions, 17 percent more than the 6,509 in 1982. The Courts of Appeals reversed, at least in part, the decision of the trial court in 12.5 percent of the cases disposed of, compared to

13.3 percent in 1982.

While the 14 Courts of Appeals operate to a large extent as autonomous courts in specific geographic areas, some equalization of the dockets occurs by transfer of cases among the courts by order of the Supreme Court, pursuant to Article 1738, V.T.C.S. The Supreme Court transferred 152 civil cases and 623 criminal cases in 1983, compared with 59 civil cases and 61 criminal cases transferred in 1982.

#### Disposition of Criminal Cases


Of the 3,518 criminal cases pending in the Courts of Appeals at the end of 1983, 46 percent

had been on the docket less than 6 months, 36 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 18 percent more than 12 months.

The average lapse of time between filing of a criminal case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 4.4 months in the Waco Court to 13.7 months in the Tyler Court. The average lapse of time for cases statewide was 10.1 months.

A case is "submitted" when the court hears oral argument or when it is referred to the justices for formal consideration if no oral argument is heard. The average lapse of time between submission of a criminal appeal and its disposition ranged from 0.4 of a month in the Waco

\* Caseloads increased sharply in 1981 when Courts of Appeals acquired criminal jurisdiction. Before 1981, caseloads included only civil cases; since 1981, both civil and criminal are included. Of the 6,092 cases pending on 12-31-83, 2,574 were civil and 3,518 were criminal.

Court to 2.9 months in the El Paso Court. The average lapse of time for cases statewide was 1.3 months.

New civil cases filed in all of the Courts of Appeals during 1983 increased 7.9 percent over 1982. More new civil cases were filed in 1983 than in 1982 in all but the Austin, Amarillo, Beaumont, Waco, and Eastland Courts. Of the courts with increased civil filings, the Thirteenth Court in Corpus Christi experienced the largest percentage increase--23.9 percent (49 cases). The Dallas Court continued to receive more new civil filings than any other court--568 compared to the average of 221 per court. The two courts in Houston, each of which has jurisdiction of the same geographical area, received a total of 697 civil cases each, 81 cases (13 percent) more than in 1982.


At the end of 1983, 2,574 civil cases were pending on the dockets of the Courts of Appeals, 5.8 percent more than the 2,432 pending on December 31, 1982. Of those civil cases pending December 31, 1983, 45.6 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 33.7 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 20.6 percent more than 12 months.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a civil case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 4.2 months in the Waco Court to 13.8 months in the Amarillo Court. The average lapse of time for cases statewide was 9.1 months.

The average lapse of time from the submission of a civil case to the court and its disposition ranged from 0.5 of a month in the Waco Court to 5.1 months in the San Antonio Court. The average lapse of time for cases statewide was 2.5 months.
