Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1989

There are 14 Courts of Appeals in Texas which, since September 1, 1981, have heard intermediate appeals in both civil and criminal cases.

Courts of Appeals are located in Fort Worth, Austin, San Antonio, Dallas, Texarkana, Amarillo, El Paso, Beaumont, Waco, Eastland, Tyler, Corpus Christi, and Houston. Houston has two Courts of Appeals. Each court has jurisdiction over a geographical district.

The number of justices for each court ranges from 3 each in five courts to 13 in Dallas, which is the largest. There are 80 justices statewide.

Pending Caseloads Increased Again

For the third consecutive year, total pending caseloads of the 14 Courts of Appeals increased during state fiscal year 1989, which ended August 31, 1989.


The Courts disposed of 8,416 total cases during the year, an average of 105 dispositions (58 criminal and 47 civil) per justice. The pending caseload increased from 5,766 at the beginning of the fiscal year to 6,163 at the end of the year.


From calendar year 1974 through 1982, the total pending caseload of the Courts of Appeals grew larger each year as more cases than the courts were able to dispose of were added. On December 31, 1982, there were 6,816 total cases pending in the Courts of Appeals.

The trend was broken in calendar year 1983 when a surge in criminal dispositions reduced the total pending caseload by year's end. In fiscal year 1984, both civil and criminal caseloads were reduced during the year.

In fiscal year 1985, the civil caseload was reduced and the criminal caseload increased slightly. In fiscal year 1986, both pending civil and criminal caseloads were again reduced.

The Courts of Appeals had 3,526 criminal cases and 2,240 civil cases pending as of September 1, 1988. On August 31, 1989, 3,704 criminal cases and 2,459 civil cases were pending. The state average for pending cases at year's end was 77 per justice. This compares to the 1982 high of 86 pending cases per justice.





The largest number of pending cases per justice (94) at the end of the fiscal year was in the First Court of Appeals in Houston. The lowest number per justice (61) was in the Thirteenth Court of Appeals in Corpus Christi.

Case Filings Increase

A total of 8,281 cases was filed in the Courts of Appeals during the fiscal year, which included 4,403 criminal cases and 3,878 civil cases. This was an increase of 3.5 percent from the 8,004 total new cases filed in fiscal year 1988. New criminal cases increased 4.2 percent from the 4,224 filed in fiscal year 1988 and civil cases increased 2.6 percent from the 3,780 filed in fiscal year 1988.

Considering civil and criminal cases together, the First Court of Appeals in Houston had the highest average number of new cases filed per justice (145) during fiscal year 1989. The other courts ranged down to 52 cases per justice filed in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana. State average filings were 104 per justice.

Approximately 30 percent of all new cases filed in a Court of Appeals in Texas in fiscal year 1989 were filed in one of the two Courts located in Houston. Approximately 18 percent of all cases filed in the State were filed in the Fifth Court of Appeals in Dallas.

Criminal Dispositions Increase

Criminal dispositions increased 11.4 percent from 4,152 dispositions in fiscal year 1988 to 4,627 dispositions in fiscal year 1989.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a criminal case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 6.4 months in the Eleventh Court of Appeals in Eastland to 11.8 months in the Fourth Court of Appeals in San Antonio. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 9 months.

The average lapse of time between submission of a criminal appeal and its disposition ranged from 0.3 of a month in the Ninth Court of Appeals in Beaumont to 3.8 months in the Fourth Court of Appeals in San Antonio. The average lapse of time for the courts was 1.6 months.

Of the 3,704 criminal cases pending in the Courts of Appeals at the end of fiscal year 1989, 55 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 31 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 14 percent more than 12 months.

Civil Dispositions

In fiscal year 1989, there were 3,789 civil dispositions by the Courts of Appeal, a decrease of 1.1 percent over the 3,832 civil dispositions in fiscal year 1988.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a civil case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 5.3 months in the Eighth Court of Appeals in El Paso to 9 months in the Third Court of Appeals in Austin. The average lapse of time in the 14 courts for civil cases was 6.8 months.

The average lapse of time from the submission of a civil case to the court and its disposition ranged from 0.7 months in the Eighth Court of Appeals in El Paso to 3.4 months in the Third Court of Appeals in Austin. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 1.7 months. A case is "submitted" when the court hears oral argument or when it is referred to the justices for formal consideration if no oral argument is heard.

The Fourteenth Court of Appeals in Houston disposed of the largest total number of cases per justice (129) during fiscal year 1989. The lowest number per justice (70) was in the Tenth Court of Appeals in Waco. State average dispositions were 105 per justice.


At the end of fiscal year 1989, 2,459 civil cases were pending on the dockets of the Courts of Appeals, 9.8 percent more than the 2,240 pending on September 1, 1988. Of those civil cases pending on August 31, 1989, 58 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 27 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 15 percent for more than 12 months.

Opinions Written

In fiscal year 1989, the justices of the Courts of Appeals wrote 7,993 opinions, 5 percent more than the 7,593 written in 1988.

The Courts of Appeals reversed, at least in part, the decision of the trial court in 13.9 percent of the cases disposed of during the fiscal year 1989, a 0.7 percent decrease from fiscal year 1988.

While the 14 Courts of Appeals operate to a large extent as autonomous courts in specific geographic districts, some equalization of the dockets occurs by transfer of cases among the courts on order of the Supreme Court, pursuant to statutory authority. The Supreme Court transferred a total of 188 civil cases and 276 criminal cases among the courts in fiscal year 1989, compared with 18 civil cases and 176 criminal cases transferred in fiscal year 1988.
