Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1990

There are 14 Courts of Appeals in Texas which, since September 1, 1981, have heard intermediate appeals in civil and criminal cases.

Courts of Appeals are located in Fort Worth, Austin, San Antonio, Dallas, Texarkana, Amarillo, El Paso, Beaumont, Waco, Eastland, Tyler, Corpus Christi, and Houston. Houston has two Courts of Appeals. Each court has jurisdiction over a geographical district.

The number of justices for each court ranges from 3 each in five courts to 13 in Dallas, which is the largest. There are 80 justices statewide.

PENDING CASELOADS INCREASED AGAIN

For the fourth consecutive year, total pending caseloads of the 14 Courts of Appeals increased during the State fiscal year which ended August 31.

The pending caseload increased from 6,198 at the beginning of the fiscal year 1990 to 6,393 at the end of the fiscal year.

From calendar year 1974 through 1982, the total pending caseload of the Courts of Appeals grew larger each year as more cases than the courts were


able to dispose of were added. On December 31, 1982, there were 6,816 total cases pending in the Courts of Appeals.


The trend was broken in calendar year 1983 when a surge in criminal dispositions reduced the total pending caseload by year's end. In fiscal year 1984, civil and criminal caseloads were reduced during the year.

In fiscal year 1985, the civil caseload was reduced and the criminal caseload increased slightly. In fiscal year 1986, pending civil and criminal caseloads were again reduced.

The Courts of Appeals had 3,720 criminal cases and 2,478 civil cases pending as of September 1, 1989. On August 31, 1990, 3,848 criminal cases and 2,545 civil cases were pending. The State average for pending cases at year's end was 80 per justice. This compares to the 1982 high of 86 pending cases per justice.

Of the 3,848 criminal cases pending in the Courts of Appeals at the end of fiscal year 1990, 51 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 33 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 16 percent more than 12 months.





*Courts of Appeals acquired intermediate appellate criminal jurisdiction in 1981.

At the end of fiscal year 1990, 2,545 civil cases were pending on the dockets of the Courts of Appeals, 3.5 percent more than the 2,459 pending on September 1, 1989. Of those civil cases pending on August 31, 1990, 55 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 30 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 15 percent for more than 12 months.

The largest number of pending cases per justice (119) at the end of the fiscal year was in the Twelfth Court of Appeals in Tyler. The lowest number per justice (27) was in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana.

CASE FILINGS

A total of 8,062 cases was filed in the Courts of Appeals during the fiscal year, which included 4,080 criminal cases and 3,982 civil cases. This was an decrease of 2.7 percent from the 8,281 total new cases filed in fiscal year 1989. New criminal cases decreased 7.4 percent from the 4,403 filed in fiscal year 1989 and civil cases increased 2.7 percent from the 3,878 filed in fiscal year 1989.

Considering civil and criminal cases together, the First Court of Appeals in Houston had the highest average number of new cases filed per justice (127) during fiscal year 1990. The other courts ranged down to 42 cases per justice filed in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana. State average filings were 101 per justice.

Approximately 28 percent of all new cases filed in a Court of Appeals in Texas in fiscal year 1990 were filed in one of the two Courts located in Houston.

Approximately 19 percent of all cases filed in the State were filed in the Fifth Court of Appeals in Dallas.

DISPOSITIONS

The Court disposed of 8,134 total cases during the year, an average of 102 dispositions (51 criminal and 51 civil) per justice.

The Fourteenth Court of Appeals in Houston disposed of the largest total number of cases per justice (119) during fiscal year 1990. The lowest number per justice (81) was in the Twelfth Court of Appeals in Tyler. State average dispositions were 102 per justice.

CRIMINAL DISPOSITIONS

Criminal dispositions increased 11.7 percent from 4,627 dispositions in fiscal year 1989 to 4,087 dispositions in fiscal year 1990.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a criminal case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 7.4 months in the Seventh Court of Appeals in Amarillo to 12.6 months in the Second Court of Appeals in Fort Worth. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 10 months.

The average lapse of time between submission of a criminal appeal and its disposition ranged from 0.6 of a month in the Seventh Court of Appeals in Amarillo to 4 months in the Second Court of Appeals in Fort Worth. The average lapse of time for the courts was 1.8 months.

CIVIL DISPOSITIONS

In fiscal year 1990, there were 4,047 civil dispositions by the Courts of Appeal, an increase of 6.9 percent over the 3,789 civil dispositions in fiscal year 1989.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a civil case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 5.7 months in the Eighth Court of Appeals in El Paso to 10.9 months in the Ninth Court of Appeals in Beaumont. The average lapse of time in the 14 courts for civil cases was 7.7 months.

The average lapse of time from the submission of a civil case to the court and its disposition ranged from 0.8 months in the Eighth Court of Appeals in El Paso to 3.8 months in the Third Court of Appeals in Austin. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 2.1 months. A case is "submitted" when the court hears oral argument or when it is referred to the justices for formal consideration if no oral argument is heard.


OPINIONS WRITTEN

In fiscal year 1990, the justices of the Courts of Appeals wrote 7,511 opinions, 6.1 percent less than the 7,993 written in 1989.

The Courts of Appeals reversed, at least in part, the decision of the trial court in 13.4 percent of the cases disposed of during fiscal year 1990, a 0.5 percent decrease from fiscal year 1989.

CASES TRANSFERRED

While the 14 Courts of Appeals operate to a large extent as autonomous courts in specific geographic districts, some equalization of the dockets occurs by transfer of cases among the courts on order of the Supreme Court, pursuant to statutory authority. The Supreme Court transferred a total of 27 civil cases and 130 criminal cases among the courts in fiscal year 1990, compared with 188 civil cases and 276 criminal cases transferred in fiscal year 1989.
