Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1991

There are 14 Courts of Appeals in Texas which, since September 1, 1981, have heard intermediate appeals in civil and criminal cases.

Courts of Appeals are located in Fort Worth, Austin, San Antonio, Dallas, Texarkana, Amarillo, El Paso, Beaumont, Waco, Eastland, Tyler, Corpus Christi, and Houston. Houston has two Courts of Appeals. Each court has jurisdiction over a geographical district.

The number of justices for each court ranges from 3 each in five courts to 13 in Dallas, which is the largest. There are 80 justices statewide.

PENDING CASELOADS INCREASED AGAIN

For the fifth consecutive year, total pending caseloads of the 14 Courts of Appeals increased during the State fiscal year which ended August 31, 1991.

The pending caseload increased from 6,403 at the beginning of the fiscal year 1991 to 7,125 at the end of the fiscal year.

From calendar year 1974 through 1982, the total pending caseload of the Courts of Appeals grew larger each year as more cases than the courts were

able to dispose of were added. On December 31, 1982, there were 6,816 total cases pending in the Courts of Appeals.


The trend was broken in calendar year 1983 when a surge in criminal dispositions reduced the total pending caseload by year's end. In fiscal year 1984, civil and criminal caseloads were reduced during the year.


In fiscal year 1985, the civil caseload was reduced and the criminal caseload increased slightly. In fiscal year 1986, pending civil and criminal caseloads were again reduced.

The Courts of Appeals had 3,857 criminal cases and 2,456 civil cases pending as of September 1, 1990. On August 31, 1991, 4,485 criminal cases and 2,640 civil cases were pending. The State average for pending cases at year's end was 89 per justice. This compares to the 1982 high of 86 pending cases per justice.

Of the 4,485 criminal cases pending in the Courts of Appeals at the end of fiscal year 1991, 48 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 34 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 18 percent more than 12 months.

At the end of fiscal year 1991, 2,640 civil cases were pending on the dockets of the Courts of Appeals, 3.7 percent more than the 2,546 pending on September 1, 1990. Of those civil cases pending on August 31, 1991, 54 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 29 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 17 percent for more than 12 months.

The largest number of pending cases per justice (125) at the end of the fiscal year was in the Twelfth Court of Appeals in Tyler. The lowest number per justice (58) was in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana.

NEW CASE FILINGS

A total of 8,563 new cases was filed in the Courts of Appeals during the fiscal year, which included 4,627 criminal cases and 3,936 civil cases. This was an increase of 6.2 percent from the 8,062 total new cases filed in fiscal year 1990. New criminal cases increased 13 percent from the 4,080 filed in fiscal year 1990 and civil cases decreased 1 percent from the 3,982 filed in fiscal year 1990.

Considering civil and criminal cases together, the Fourteenth Court of Appeals in Houston had the highest average number of new cases filed per justice (132) during fiscal year 1991. The other courts ranged down to 48 cases per justice filed in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana. State average filings were 107 per justice.

Approximately 28 percent of all new cases filed in a Court of Appeals in Texas in fiscal year 1991 were filed in one of the two Courts located in Houston.

Approximately 20 percent of all new cases filed in the State were filed in the Fifth Court of Appeals in Dallas.

DISPOSITIONS

The Court disposed of 8,091 total cases during the year, an average of 101 dispositions (51 criminal and 50 civil) per justice.

The Fifth Court of Appeals in Dallas disposed of the largest total number of cases per justice (124) during fiscal year 1991. The lowest number per justice (72) was in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana. State average dispositions were 101 per justice.

CRIMINAL DISPOSITIONS

Criminal dispositions increased 1 percent from 4,087 dispositions in fiscal year 1990 to 4,123 dispositions in fiscal year 1991.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a criminal case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 6.9 months in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana to 13.8 months in the Tenth Court of Appeals in Waco. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 10.8 months.

The average lapse of time between submission of a criminal appeal and its disposition ranged from 0.8 of a month in the Fifth and Eighth Courts of Appeals in Dallas and El Paso to 3.2 months in the Second and Third Courts of Appeals in Fort Worth and Austin. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 2 months.

CIVIL DISPOSITIONS

In fiscal year 1991, there were 3,968 civil dispositions by the Courts of Appeal, a decrease of 1.9 percent from the 4,047 civil dispositions in fiscal year 1990.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a civil case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 5.9 months in the Fifth and Sixth Courts of Appeals in Dallas and Texarkana to 11.3 months in the Third Court of Appeals in Austin. The average lapse of time in the 14 courts for civil cases was 8.3 months.

The average lapse of time from the submission of a civil case to the court and its disposition ranged from 1 month in the Fifth Court of Appeals in Dallas to 5.3 months in the Second Court of Appeals in Fort Worth. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 2.9 months. A case is "submitted" when the court hears oral argument or when it is referred to the justices for formal consideration if no oral argument is heard.


OPINIONS WRITTEN

In fiscal year 1991, the justices of the Courts of Appeals wrote 7,545 opinions, 0.5 percent more than the 7,511 written in 1990.

The Courts of Appeals reversed, at least in part, the decision of the trial court in 12.8 percent of the cases disposed of during fiscal year 1991, a 0.6 percent decrease from fiscal year 1990.

CASES TRANSFERRED

While the 14 Courts of Appeals operate to a large extent as autonomous courts in specific geographic districts, some equalization of the dockets occurs by transfer of cases among the courts on order of the Supreme Court, pursuant to statutory authority. The Supreme Court transferred a total of 180 civil cases and 209 criminal cases among the courts in fiscal year 1991, compared with 27 civil cases and 130 criminal cases transferred in fiscal year 1990.
