Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1992

There are 14 Courts of Appeals in Texas which, since September 1, 1981, have heard intermediate appeals in civil and criminal cases.

Courts of Appeals are located in Fort Worth, Austin, San Antonio, Dallas, Texarkana, Amarillo, El Paso, Beaumont, Waco, Eastland, Tyler, Corpus Christi, and Houston. Houston has two Courts of Appeals. Each court has jurisdiction over a geographical district. The districts of the Houston courts are coterminous.

The number of justices for each court ranges from 3 each in five courts to 13 in Dallas, which is the largest. There are 80 justices statewide.

PENDING CASELOADS INCREASED AGAIN


For the fifth consecutive year, total pending caseloads of the 14 Courts of Appeals increased


during the State fiscal year which ended August 31, 1992.

The pending caseload increased from 7,146 at the beginning of the fiscal year 1992 to 8,903 at the end of the fiscal year.

The Courts of Appeals had 4,501 criminal cases and 2,645 civil cases pending as of September 1, 1991. On August 31, 1992, 5,827 criminal cases and 3,076 civil cases were pending. The State average for pending cases at year's end was 111 per justice.

Of the 5,827 criminal cases pending in the Courts of Appeals at the end of fiscal year 1992, 47 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 37 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 16 percent more than 12 months.

At the end of fiscal year 1992, 3,076 civil cases were pending on the dockets of the Courts of Appeals, 16.3 percent more than the 2,645 pending on September 1, 1991. Of those civil cases pending on August 31, 1992, 51 percent had been on the docket less than 6 months, 35 percent from 6 to 12 months, and 14 percent for more than 12 months.

The largest number of pending cases per justice (188) at the end of the fiscal year was in the Fifth Court of Appeals in Dallas. The lowest number per justice (63) was in the Seventh Court of Appeals in Amarillo.

NEW CASE FILINGS

A total of 10,722 new cases was filed in the Courts of Appeals during the fiscal year, which included 5,960 criminal cases and 4,762 civil cases. This was an increase of 25.2 percent from the 8,563 total new cases filed in fiscal year 1991. New criminal cases increased 28.8 percent from the 4,627 filed in fiscal year 1991 and civil cases increased 21 percent from the 3,936 filed in fiscal year 1991.

Considering civil and criminal cases together, the Fifth Court of Appeals in Dallas had the highest average number of new cases filed per justice (237.4) during fiscal year 1992. The other courts ranged down to 48 cases per justice filed in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana. State average filings were 134 per justice.

Approximately 29 percent of all new cases filed in a Court of Appeals in Texas in fiscal year 1992 were filed in one of the two Courts located in Houston.

Approximately 28.8 percent of all new cases filed in the State were filed in the Fifth Court of Appeals in Dallas.

DISPOSITIONS

The Court disposed of 9,281 total cases during the year, an average of 116 dispositions (60 criminal and 56 civil) per justice.

The Fourteenth Court of Appeals in Houston disposed of the largest total number of cases per justice (143.2) during fiscal year 1992. The lowest number per justice (81.7) was in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana. State average dispositions were 116 per justice.

CRIMINAL DISPOSITIONS

Criminal dispositions increased 16.4 percent from 4,123 dispositions in fiscal year 1991 to 4,799 dispositions in fiscal year 1992.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a criminal case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 8.8 months in the Seventh Court of Appeals in Amarillo to 16.5 months in the Twelfth Court of Appeals in Tyler. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 11.6 months.

The average lapse of time between submission of a criminal appeal and its disposition ranged from 0.8 of a month in the Seventh and Fourteenth Courts of Appeals in Amarillo and Houston to 3.4 months in the Second Court of Appeals in Fort Worth. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 1.8 months.

CIVIL DISPOSITIONS

In fiscal year 1992, there were 4,482 civil dispositions by the Courts of Appeals, an increase of 13 percent from the 3,968 civil dispositions in fiscal year 1991.

The average lapse of time between the filing of a civil case in a Court of Appeals and its disposition ranged from 6.2 months in the Sixth Court of Appeals in Texarkana to 13.1 months in the Twelfth Court of Appeals in Tyler. The average lapse of time in the 14 courts for civil cases was 8.5 months.

The average lapse of time from the submission of a civil case to the court and its disposition ranged from 0.9 month in the Eighth Court of Appeals in El Paso to 5 months in the Second Court of Appeals in Fort Worth. The average lapse of time for the 14 courts was 2.6 months. A case is "submitted" when the court hears oral argument or when it is referred to the justices for formal consideration if no oral argument is heard.


OPINIONS WRITTEN

In fiscal year 1992, the justices of the Courts of Appeals wrote 8,875 opinions, 17.6 percent more than the 7.545 written in 1991.

The Courts of Appeals reversed, at least in part, the decision of the trial court in 13.1 percent of the cases disposed of during fiscal year 1992, a 0.3 percent increase from fiscal year 1991.

CASES TRANSFERRED

While the 14 Courts of Appeals operate to a large extent as autonomous courts in specific geographic districts, some equalization of the dockets occurs by transfer of cases among the courts on order of the Supreme Court, pursuant to statutory authority. The Supreme Court transferred a total of 205 civil cases and 536 criminal cases among the courts in fiscal year 1992, compared with 180 civil cases and 209 criminal cases transferred in fiscal year 1991. In addition, the two Houston Courts (1st and 14th) are authorized by statute to transfer cases between those courts. During 1992, the 1st Court transferred one civil and one criminal case to the 14th. The 14th transferred 11 civil cases and one criminal case to the 1st Court.
