Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1984

The Supreme Court of Texas is the highest state court for civil appeals and promulgates the rules of civil procedure for the courts of Texas. composed of the Chief Justice and eight justices.

The number of applications for writs of error filed in the Supreme Court during the state fiscal year ending August 31, 1984 increased substantially from calendar year 1983. A total of 987 applications were filed, compared to 703 in 1983--an increase of 40 percent, and 24 percent more than the ten-year average of 799.

In state fiscal year 1984, 94 new "regular causes"--primarily cases in which the Court hears oral argument and delivers an opinion--reached the docket, compared to 127 in calendar year 1983 and the ten-year average of 113. New civil mandamus matters decreased from 142 in 1983 to 113 in fiscal 1984.


The Supreme Court disposed of 77 percent of the regular causes docketed during fiscal 1984 or carried over from 1983, compared to 71 percent in 1983. Seventy-four percent of the applications for writs of error were disposed of during the


year, 5 percent less than during 1983.

The Court delivered 106 deciding opinions in the year ending August 31, 1984, 18 percent less than the 125 opinions in 1983. A total of 154 were written (including Rule 483 per curiam opinions), an average of 17 per justice. The Supreme Court disposed of 885 applications for writs of error from decisions of the Courts of Appeals, compared to 705 in 1983, for an average of 98 per justice. Ten percent of the 885 applications were granted. Of the granted writs, the Courts of Appeals were reversed in 61 percent of the cases, for an effective reversal rate on applications for writs of error from the Courts of Appeals of 7 percent.

Thirty-three regular causes were pending on August 31, 1984--19 less than at the end of 1983, and 8 cases less than the ten-year average. The number of applications for writs of error remaining on the docket on August 31, 1984 was 308--69 percent more than the 182 at the end of 1983, and 74 percent more than the ten-year average of 177.

Most are reviewed in contenence by the Supreme Court, before oral argument and decision, upon application for writ of error, with three or more of the justices voting that the decision of the Court of Appeals was erroneous and that the writ therefore should be granted. A similar procedure is tollowed regarding petitions for original mandamus and habeas corpus, which become "Regular Causes" only after review and vote in conference. "Cases Other Than Regular Causes" include such actions as the Court's rejection in conference of an application for writ of error or application to file a petition for original mandamus or habeas corpus. This category is obviously larger than that of regular causes.
