Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1990

The Supreme Court of Texas is the highest State court for civil appeals and promulgates rules of administration and civil procedure for the courts of Texas. It is comprised of the Chief Justice and eight justices.

The Court "passed on" (disposed of or otherwise acted upon) a total of 2,742 matters during fiscal year 1990, an increase of 7 percent from the 2,563 matters passed on in fiscal year 1989.

REGULAR CAUSES

The 158 regular causes added to the Court's docket were 12 percent more than the 141 regular causes added in fiscal year 1989.

The 154 regular causes disposed of were 11.5 percent more than the 138 disposed of in fiscal year 1989 and 17.6 percent more than the 10-year average of 131. Of the regular causes disposed of during 1990, 116 came to the Court on applications for writs of error from the 14 Courts of Appeals. Of those 116 dispositions, the lower courts were reversed in whole or in part in 95 causes, or 82 percent. This compares to 89 percent reversals in fiscal year 1989.

The 64 regular causes (including motions for rehearing) left pending at the end of fiscal year 1990 represented 29 percent of the total number of regular causes added during the year or carried over from the previous year. This is 12 causes higher than the 10-year average of 52 pending causes. At the end of fiscal year 1989, 60 regular causes had been pending in the Court.

APPLICATIONS FOR WRITS OF ERROR

The 866 applications for writs of error filed during fiscal year 1990 represented a 5.5 percent increase from the 821 applications filed in fiscal year 1989, but was 4 percent less than the 10-year average of 902.

The 876 applications for writs of error disposed of during the year was 12.2 percent more than the 781 disposed of during fiscal year 1989, but 1.2 percent lower than the 10-year average of 887. Of

the 876 applications disposed of, 84 (or 9.6 percent) were granted.

The 343 applications for writs of error left pending at the end of fiscal year 1990 represented 28 percent of the total number of such applications filed during the year or carried over from the previous year. This is 81 more pending applications than the 10-year average of 262 pending applications. At the end of fiscal year 1989, 353 applications for writs of error had been pending in the Court.

OTHER WRITS AND MOTIONS

The 780 other writs and motions filed during fiscal year 1990 were 19.8 percent more than the 651 filed during fiscal year 1989. (This does not include miscellaneous motions such as motions for extension of time, etc., which are often not docketed as separate causes.) This is 18.2 more than the 10-year average of 660 other writs and motions filed.


The 775 other writs and motions disposed of during fiscal year 1990 were 17.2 percent more than the 661 disposed during fiscal year 1989. This is 121 more dispositions than the 10-year average of 654 dispositions.

The 118 other writs and motions left pending by the Court at the end of fiscal year 1990 represented 13.7 percent of the total number of other writs and motions filed during the year or carried over from the previous year. At the end of fiscal year 1989, 113 other writs and motions had been pending in the Court.

OPINIONS WRITTEN


During fiscal year 1990, the justices of the Supreme Court wrote 187 opinions (or an average of 21 opinions each), 7.5 percent more than the 174 opinions written in fiscal year 1989 and 5.6 percent more than the 10-year average of 177. Of the opinions written in 1990, 102 (or 55 percent) were deciding opinions which disposed of causes.

During fiscal year 1990, the Supreme Court heard oral argument of 102 causes and considered an additional 35 causes submitted on briefs.



^{*}Regular Causes are regular appeals or original actions pending before the court. Normally, they reach this status when a Writ of Error is granted in the cause. Petitions for Original Mandamus and Habeas Corpus, which are not disposed of upon initial review, and in which the petition is granted, may also become regular causes.

^{**1984} and following are fiscal years; all previous are calendar years.



^{*}An Application for Writ of Error is a request filed by one of the parties, requesting the Supreme Court to review the judgment of a Court of Appeals. If four or more of the nine justices concur the writ is granted and the cause is scheduled for argument before the court.

^{**1984} and following are fiscal years; all previous are calendar years.

^{*&}quot;Regular Causes" are reported in a separate category because they are the cases which pass through most, if not all, of the steps of the regular appellate decision-making process. Regular causes are cases in which oral argument of counsel in open court is received (unless waived) and in which the Court's decision is usually reported in a written opinion. Most are reviewed in conference by the Supreme Court, before oral argument and decision, upon application for writ of error, with four or more of the justices voting that the decision of the Court of Appeals was erroneous and that the writ therefore should be granted. A similiar procedure is followed regarding petitions for original mandamus and habeas corpus, which become "Regular Causes" only after review and vote in conference of an application for writ of error or application to file a petition for original mandamus or habeas corpus. This category is obviously larger than that of regular causes.
