## Analysis of Activity for the Year Ending August 31, 1991

The Supreme Court of Texas is the highest State court for civil appeals and promulgates rules of administration and civil procedure for the courts of Texas. It is comprised of the Chief Justice and eight justices.

The Court "passed on" (disposed of or otherwise acted upon) a total of 2,658 matters during fiscal year 1991, a decrease of 3 percent from the 2,742 matters passed on in fiscal year 1990.

#### REGULAR CAUSES

The 154 regular causes added to the Court's docket were 2.5 percent less than the 158 regular causes added in fiscal year 1990.

The 145 regular causes disposed of were 5.8 percent less than the 154 disposed of in fiscal year 1990 and 6.6 percent more than the 10-year average of 136. Of the regular causes disposed of during 1991, 107 came to the Court on applications for writs of error from the 14 Courts of Appeals. Of those 107 dispositions, the lower courts were reversed in whole or in part in 75 causes, or 70 percent. This compares to 82 percent reversals in fiscal year 1990.

The 81 regular causes (including motions for rehearing) left pending at the end of fiscal year 1991 represented 36 percent of the total number of regular causes added during the year or carried over from the previous year. This is 24 causes higher than the 10-year average of 57 pending causes. At the end of fiscal year 1990, 64 regular causes had been pending in the Court.

#### APPLICATIONS FOR WRITS OF ERROR

The 1,055 applications for writs of error filed during fiscal year 1991 represented a 21.8 percent increase from the 866 applications filed in fiscal year 1990, and was 14.4 percent higher than the 10-year average of 922.

The 1,051 applications for writs of error disposed of during the year were 19.2 percent more than the 876 disposed of during fiscal year 1990, and 15.6 percent higher than the 10-year average of 909.

Of the 1,051 applications disposed of, 130 (or 12.4 percent) were granted.

The 424 applications for writs of error left pending at the end of fiscal year 1991 represented 29 percent of the total number of such applications filed during the year or carried over from the previous year. This is 123 more pending applications than the 10-year average of 301 pending applications. At the end of fiscal year 1990, 343 applications for writs of error had been pending in the Court.

#### OTHER WRITS AND MOTIONS

The 1,502 other writs and motions filed during fiscal year 1991 were 92.5 percent more than the 780 filed during fiscal year 1990. (This does not include miscellaneous motions such as motions for extension of time, etc., which are often not docketed as separate causes.) This is 53.7 percent more than the 10-year average of 977 other writs and motions filed.


The 1,462 other writs and motions disposed of during fiscal year 1991 were 88.6 percent more than the 775 disposed during fiscal year 1990. This is 588 more dispositions than the 10-year average of 874 dispositions.

The 158 other writs and motions left pending by the Court at the end of fiscal year 1991 represented 9.8 percent of the total number of other writs and motions filed during the year or carried over from the previous year. At the end of fiscal year 1990, 118 other writs and motions had been pending in the Court.

#### **OPINIONS WRITTEN**


During fiscal year 1991, the justices of the Supreme Court wrote 211 opinions (or an average of 23 opinions each), 12.8 percent more than the 187 opinions written in fiscal year 1990 and 14.7 percent more than the 10-year average of 184. Of the opinions written in 1991, 119 (or 56 percent) were deciding opinions which disposed of causes.

During fiscal year 1991, the Supreme Court heard oral argument of 71 causes and considered an additional 38 causes submitted on briefs.



<sup>\*</sup>Regular Causes are regular appeals or original actions pending before the court. Normally, they reach this status when a Writ of Error is granted in the cause. Petitions for Original Mandamus and Habeas Corpus, which are not disposed of upon initial review, and in which the petition is granted, may also become regular causes.

<sup>\*\*1984</sup> and following are fiscal years; all previous are calendar years.



<sup>\*</sup>An Application for Writ of Error is a request filed by one of the parties, requesting the Supreme Court to review the judgment of a Court of Appeals. If four or more of the nine justices concur the writ is granted and the cause is scheduled for argument before the court.

<sup>\*&</sup>quot;Regular Causes" are reported in a separate category because they are the cases which pass through most, if not all, of the steps of the regular appellate decision-making process. Regular causes are cases in which oral argument of counsel in open court is received (unless waived) and in which the Court's decision is usually reported in a written opinion. Most are reviewed in conference by the Supreme Court, before oral argument and decision, upon application for writ of error, with four or more the justices voting that the decision of the Court of Appeals was erroneous and that the writ therefore should be granted. A similiar procedure is followed regarding petitions for original mandamus and habeas corpus, which become "Regular Causes" only after review and vote in conference of an application for writ of error or application to file a petition for original mandamus or habeas corpus. This category is obviously larger than that of regular causes.
