




eFileTexas Status

Transaction Volume: 5/1/2016 to 7/31/2016



Summary

- Over 147k user accounts created to-date
- EFM currently receiving ~20,000 envelopes per day
- State filing portal accounts for 75.8% of transactions; remaining 24.2% stem from commercial EFSP submissions

Criminal Mandate



The Court of Criminal Appeals chose to mandate e-filing in criminal matters in June 2016

- Impacts all 254 counties
- Graduated scheduled roll-out, based on county population
- Begins in July 2017 and ends in January 2020





Phase 1 & 2 Summary

- 22 counties in plan for Phase 1 & 2
- 17 counties wholly new to criminal e-filing
- 5 counties currently live with criminal e-filing
- 2 offices within counties currently accepting criminal e-filing

Phase 3 – 6 Summary

- 17 counties in plan for Phase 3
- 23 counties in plan for Phase 4
- 56 counties in plan for Phase 5
- 136 counties in plan for Phase 6

TX E-Filing: Criminal




Summary

eFileTexas Self Help Progress




Summary

- 7 interviews available today, including the Divorce without Children kit
- 13 counties currently live with eFileTexas integration
- 3.14 release includes development to rapidly allow the integration of ~220 non-integrated offices


July Statistics:
