**Order to Declare Defendant a
Vexatious Litigant**


After considering the motion of Walker, Flood, and Casey to declare Coyle a vexatious litigant, Coyle's response, the evidence presented at the hearing, and the arguments of counsel, the Court

GRANTS the motion, declares plaintiff Anne Coyle a vexatious litigant, and orders as follows:

1. Plaintiff must furnish security for the benefit of Walker, Flood, and Casey, within ten (10) days, by posting a bond with the clerk of the court in certified funds, the amount of \$50,000.00. The security is to assure payment to Walker, Flood, and Casey for reasonable expenses, including their court costs and attorney fees, should the case be dismissed on the merits.
2. If plaintiff does not furnish security within the time limit set by this order, the Court will dismiss this suit with prejudice against plaintiff.
3. This suit will remain in abatement, subject to the pending TRCP 91a motion, until plaintiff complies with this order or until it is dismissed by further order of this Court.
4. Plaintiff must not file as a pro se party any new litigation in a court in Texas against any party without first obtaining permission from the appropriate local administrative judge as required by Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code section 11.102(a).
5. As required by Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code section 11.104, the court clerk will provide a copy of this order to the Office of Court Administration of the Texas Judicial System.
