At its April 4, 2014 meeting, the Texas Forensic Science Commission voted to dismiss your complaint. Your complaint requests information from the Bexar County crime laboratory regarding DNA testing performed in your criminal case. The Commission does not have authority to compel any laboratory to respond to Public Information Act ("PIA") requests made by inmates. See Tex. Code Crim. Proc. art 38.01. The policy of the Bexar County crime laboratory is to provide responsive material to the PIA requests of inmates who are represented by legal counsel only. Therefore, you may consider contacting the attorneys at the Innocence Project of Texas for assistance with your PIA request.
