Dear Ms. Jenkins:

At its April 12, 2016 meeting, the Commission voted unanimously to dismiss your complaint.

Your complaint alleges various problems regarding the investigation and prosecution of your son's intoxication manslaughter case. Though you make blanket allegations of malfeasance by the crime laboratory, there is nothing in the materials to merit a further review of those blanket allegations. Additionally, the allegations regarding police misconduct and prosecution misconduct are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction, as our investigative authority is limited to forensic analysis.
