Dear Mr. Reyes:

At its July 8, 2016 meeting, the Commission voted unanimously to dismiss your complaint for failure to state an allegation of negligence or misconduct related to any forensic analysis. Your complaint requests further DNA testing of evidentiary items, a request beyond the Commission's jurisdiction. The Commission does not have the authority to issue an opinion related to the failure to conduct DNA testing or to order DNA testing in any criminal case.

The Commission has however forwarded your file to its DNA mixture retroactive case review panel for evaluation. You will be contacted should the panel conclude that your case warrants recalculation of the DNA evidence. Mr. Bob Wicoff, Appellate Division Chief of the Harris County Public Defender's Office is overseeing this project and has been copied on this letter.
