Re: Texas Forensic Science Commission ("TFSC") Complaint

Dear Mr. Gray:

This letter is to inform you that your complaint has been dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. As stated in the cover letter to the complaint form ("...the term "forensic analysis" does not include the portion of an autopsy conducted by a medical examiner or other forensic pathologist who is a licensed physician. Please be advised that if you submit a complaint regarding the results of an autopsy, it is highly likely your complaint will be dismissed.") TFSC has no authority over the portion of an autopsy performed by a medical examiner or other licensed physician. Medical professionals have their own regulatory body, The Texas Medical Board.

After reviewing the allegations in your complaint, no laboratory analyses within TFSC's authority appear to be at issue. It appears instead that the gist of your complaint is differing medical opinions concerning manner and cause of death, specifically outside this commission's jurisdiction.

For your convenience, I am enclosing a list of innocence clinics operating in Texas should you wish to submit your case to one for consideration. Thank you and please let me know if I may be of any additional assistance.
