Dear Mr. Drummer:

At its May 26, 2017 meeting, the TFSC dismissed your complaint because the forensic analysis in question occurred in 1991, prior to the effective date of the crime lab accreditation program in Texas (2003). TFSC may only perform best-practices reviews for analyses done prior to the enactment of the accreditation program. Commissioners did not believe the allegations in your complaint merited a best-practices review.

Commissioners found the allegations in your complaint related to the ballistics analysis and handling of the weapon in your case unsupported by the material provided. Several of the allegations (handling of evidence by police, requests for additional testing, questionable evidence admitted by the trial court) are completely beyond the TFSC's scope of authority and/or control, and should be handled by your legal representative.

If you need counsel, I have enclosed a list of innocence clinics operating in the state that you may submit your case to for review. Thank you.
