Dear Mr. Gomez-Reyes:

This letter is to let you know that your complaint has been dismissed by the TFSC for lack of jurisdiction. The TFSC has no authority over attorneys, nor does it have authority to order the performance of additional DNA testing in your case. Your complaint involves two issues: (1) loss of documents and test results by your attorney; and (2) a request for additional forensic testing.

TFSC's jurisdiction is limited to allegations of negligence and misconduct in forensic analyses performed by a crime laboratory or other entity. Neither issue raised in your complaint falls within that category.

I am enclosing a list of publicly funded innocence clinics operating in Texas and their contact information should you wish to contact them about the possibility of taking your case. Thank you and let me know if I may be of any additional assistance.
