This letter is let you know that the referenced complaint against Harris County Institute of Forensic Sciences has been dismissed by the Commission for failure to allege negligence or misconduct in connection with a forensic analysis in your case. Your complaint makes general allegations unrelated to results of any laboratory tests performed in your case.

Laboratories provide results only to their client(s); it is up to that client to provide results to other parties. The Commission cannot order labs to provide test results to anyone other than the party that ordered the testing, nor can it order testing on items of evidence not previously analyzed in a case.

This Commission does not assist with requests for recommendations for legal counsel. I am enclosing a list of innocence clinics operating in the State of Texas should you wish to submit your case to them for review and possible representation.
