History of regulation of Texas interpreters

Prior to 2001

- In state courts, no regulating body to qualify interpreters.
- In federal courts, the Administrative Office of the United States Courts was the regulating body.

Since 2001

- Spoken language interpreters are regulated by the Judicial Branch Certification Commission (JBCC) under Texas Office of Court Administration (OCA).
- 2. Sign language interpreters are regulated by the Board for Evaluation of Interpreters (BEI) under Health and Human Services (HHS).



The need for court interpreters in Texas

One in six Texans reports to be Limited English Proficient (LEP)



Top Languages spoken by LEP's Spanish Vietnamese Mandarin Korean




When is a spoken or sign language interpreter appointed by the court?

TEXAS GOVERMENT CODE, SEC 57.002

Any of the following may apply:

Upon the motion of a party
 Upon the request of a witness
 Upon the motion of the court





Who can act as a spoken language interpreter in my county?

TEX GOV'T CODE, SEC 57.002

Court proceedings in counties with a population \leq 50,000

- 1. Must be qualified as an 'expert' under Texas Rules of Evidence.
- 2. Must be at least 18 years of age.

3. Must not be a party to the proceeding.

Court proceedings in counties with a population \geq 50,000

1. Spanish interpreters must be licensed court interpreters.

 For any other language, if no licensed interpreter is found within 75 miles, a court may appoint an unlicensed interpreter.



When is a spoken language interpreter appointed by the court in criminal cases?

TEX CODE OF CRIM PROC, ART 38.30

Upon the motion for appointment of an interpreter, the interpreter must be sworn to interpret for the person charged or the witness.

The interpreter is under the same rules and penalties as those provided for witnesses.

If the available interpreter is not adequately equipped to interpret, the person charged or witness may be permitted by the court to nominate another individual who will act as an intermediary between the LEP and the appointed interpreter during the proceeding.



When is a sign language interpreter appointed by the court in criminal cases?

TEX CODE OF CRIM PROC, ART 38.31

Upon the motion for appointment of an interpreter for deaf persons by a party or the court, a qualified interpreter must be sworn to interpret for the person charged or the witness.

"Qualified interpreter" means an interpreter who holds a legal certificate issued by National Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf or a current court interpreter certificate issued by the Board for Evaluation of Interpreters.





When is a spoken or sign language interpreter appointed by the court in civil cases?

TEX RULES OF CIVIL PROC, RULE 183

 The court may appoint an interpreter of its own selection and may fix the interpreter's reasonable compensation. The compensation shall be paid out of funds provided by law or by one or more of the parties as the court may direct, and may be taxed ultimately as costs, in the discretion of the court.



How does Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 impact interpreters in the court system?

Guidance letter to all State Court Administrators

• The Department of Justice (DOJ) guidance refers to the importance of meaningful access to courts and courtrooms, without distinguishing among civil, criminal or administrative matters. It states that "every effort should be taken to ensure competent interpretation for LEP individuals during *all* hearings, trials, and motions."¹


- Free court remote interpreting services via telephone or videoconference.

- By advanced scheduling or on demand, upon interpreter's availability.




Finding a Court Interpreter

Spoken language interpreters^[1] play a vital role in ensuring due process and helping court proceedings function efficiently and effectively. The Judicial Branch Certification Commission (JBCC), of the Office of Court Administration (OCA), licenses court interpreters.

While the courts are responsible for locating and scheduling language interpreters, the OCA Language Access Department can provide resources and information to facilitate the courts' use of interpreters. OCA also operates the Texas Court Remote Interpreter Service (TCRIS), which provides licensed Spanish court interpreters at no cost to courts, via telephone and videoconference.



Step 1: Click Texas Court Remote Interpreter Service


