The Court FINDS that all the notices and time deadlines required by the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code Chapter 11 have been met or exceeded in this matter. The Court further FINDS that Drue Allen Hollis meets the criteria established by the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code Chapter 11 for him to be declared a vexatious litigant for all purposes.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Drue Allen Hollis is hereby declared to be a vexatious litigant for all purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that proceedings in this matter are hereby stayed; that Drue Allen Hollis is ORDERED to provide security to Defendant MHMR of Tarrant County by posting a bond with this Court in the amount of 19,311.17 to cover reasonable expenses incurred in or in connection with the litigation commenced by Drue Allen Hollis including costs and attorney fees; that, if Drue Allen Hollis fails to post said bond with the Court within 30 calendar days of the signing of this Order, then this suit will be dismissed with prejudice in its entirety pursuant to section 11.056 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code without further notice to Hollis.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Drue Allen Hollis is prohibited from filing, *in propria persona*, any new litigation in a court in this State without the written permission of a local administrative judge in the jurisdiction where he attempts to file such litigation. The local administrative judge may condition prefiling permission on the furnishing of security for the benefit of defendant(s) or other conditions as provided by Chapter 11 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if Drue Allen Hollis violates this prefiling Order, he will be subject to contempt of court, in addition to the other remedies provided by the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED because the Court has granted the Motion on the grounds asserted under Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code Chapter 11, the Court does not reach any grounds for dismissal asserted in the Motion under Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 91a or the Please to the Jurisdiction, which are DEEMED MOOT.
