Re: Annual Report to Judicial Branch Certification Commission (JBCC) – Calendar Year 2021
Due January 31, 2022

Texas Estates Code 1104.258 [formerly Probate Code § 697A(b)] and Rule 7.3(g) of the JBCC Rules require the Health & Human Services Commission Office of Guardianship (formerly known as DADS Guardianship Program) to submit a statement to the Judicial Branch Certification Commission (JBCC). The statement must include the name, address and telephone number of each employee who has provided guardianship services to a ward of HHSC in 2021, is currently or will be providing guardianship services to a ward of HHSC, the county or counties in which each employee is providing or is authorized to provide those services, and the total number of wards who receive guardianship services from the Office of Guardianship, which is a new reporting requirement in Rule 7.3(g) of the JBCC Rules effective April 12, 2018.

Following the same protocol as previous years, HHSC will send one report to the JBCC for all its affected employees.
