At its April 22, 2022 quarterly meeting, commissioners voted unanimously to dismiss the referenced complaint for lack of jurisdiction. The complaint requests re-testing of DNA blood evidence which the Commission does not have the authority to order.

An order for re-testing of case evidence should come from a court of competent jurisdiction. This Commission can review results of forensic testing but cannot order it in any case. You may file a complaint in the future should you have a complaint about forensic testing. Enclosed is a list of innocence clinics operating in Texas should you wish to contact one about your case.
