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| 2 | (a) A guardian of the person or of the estate of a ward must annually receive training provided on |
| 3 | the Commission's website regarding Alzheimer's disease, dementia, and related disorders, if |
| 4 | the ward is: |
| 5 | (1) 60 years of age or older; or |
| 6 | (2) is diagnosed as having Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or a related disorder. |
| 7 | (b) The Commission must provide the guardian the web address for the training or, upon request, |
| 8 | the written training materials and instruction for completing the training requirement. |
| 9 | (c) A guardian must complete the initial training no later than six months after the date of the |
| 10 | guardian's appointment. If the ward of a guardian becomes 60 years of age during the |
| 11 | guardianship, the guardian must complete the training no later than six months after the ward's |
| 12 | 60 th birthday. Each guardian who is subject to the training requirement must repeat the training |
| 13 | at least once per year until the termination of the guardianship. |
| 14 | (d) A guardian is not required to complete the training under this Rule if: |
| 15 | (1) the guardian is a certified guardian, attorney, or a corporate fiduciary; |

| 20 | (e) The training must include information regarding: |

| 23 | (3) effective strategies for communicating with a person who is diagnosed with dementia |

| 25 | (4) effective strategies and resources available for supporting a person who is diagnosed |

| 1 | (5) any other subjects or matters that would be beneficial for a guardian to know in tending |
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| 2 | to the health, safety, well-being and interests of a person who is diagnosed with |

| 4 | (f) In accordance with Section 155.203(b)(2) of the Government Code, a probate court must ensure |
