3.4 Alternative <u>Certification Application Procedure</u> for Military Spouses, Military Service Member, and Veterans

- Pursuant to Chapter 55 of the Occupations Code, the Commission must grant eredit toward 3 (a) certification, registration, or a license to and licensing requirements for relevant verified 4 military service education, training, and experience earned by a military service member, 5 or a military veteran, or military spouse who applies for certification, registration, or 6 licensure. The Commission may withhold credit from a military service member or veteran 7 who currently holds, in good standing, a restricted certification, registration, or license, 8 9 similar in scope of practice, issued by another state jurisdiction or has an unacceptable eriminal history. The Commission must issue a certification, registration, or license to a 10 military service member, military veteran, or a military spouse who within the five years 11 preceding the application date, held a certification, registration, or license in this State. 12 (b) The Commission must expedite applications for certification, registration, and licensure 13 which are filed by military service members, military veterans, and military spouses. 14 The Commission may issue a certification, registration, or license to an applicant who is a 15 (c) military service member, the spouse of a military service member, or a military veteran 16 17 and: holds a current certification, registration, or license issued by another state that has 18 (1)requirements that are substantially equivalent to the requirements for the 19 certification, registration, or license; or 20 21 (2) within the five years preceding the application date, held a certification,
- 22 registration, or license in this State.
 - (d) The Commission may allow an applicant who meets the requirements of (c) to demonstrate
 competency by alternative methods or credentials in order to meet the requirements for
 obtaining a particular certification, registration, or license issued by the Commission. For
 purposes of this Section, the standard methods of demonstrating competency are the
 specific exam, education, and experience required to obtain a particular certification,
 registration, or license.

1	(e)	In lieu of the standard methods of demonstrating competency for a particular certification,
2		registration, or license and based on the applicant's circumstances, the alternative methods

21		(1) The Commission must issue a military spouse written confirmation that the military
22		spouse may engage temporarily in a regulated practice without certification,
23		registration, or licensure, upon:
24		(A) receipt of written notice from the military spouse of the intent to engage in
25		the regulated practice in Texas;

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1		(B) receipt of a copy of the military spouse's <u>marriage license</u> military
2		identification card and proof of residency in Texas, including a copy of the
3		permanent change of station order for the military service member to whom
4		the spouse is married, including a copy of the permanent change of station
5		order for the military service member to whom the spouse is married; and
6		(C) verification that the military spouse is certified, registered, or licensed in
7		good standing in another jurisdiction that has certification, registration, or
8		licensing requirements that are substantially equivalent to the Commission's
