

Court Structure of Texas (October 2025)

County Trial Courts of Limited Jurisdiction

County-Level Courts (541 Courts – 541 Judges)

Constitutional County Courts (254) (1 in each county)

- Original jurisdiction in civil actions between \$200 and \$20,000
- Probate, mental health and guardianship (contested matters may be transferred to District Court)
- Exclusive original jurisdiction over misdemeanors with fines greater than \$500 or jail sentence
- Juvenile matters
- Appeals de novo from lower courts or on the record from municipal courts of record

Statutory County Courts (262) (in 92 counties plus 2 multi-county courts covering 6 counties)

- All civil, criminal, original and appellate actions prescribed by law for constitutional county courts
- In addition, jurisdiction over civil matters between \$200 and \$250,000 (some courts may have higher maximum jurisdiction amount)

Statutory Probate Courts (25) (in 12 counties)

 Limited primarily to probate, mental health and guardianship matters

Local Trial Courts of Limited Jurisdiction

Justice Courts¹ (796 Courts – 797 Judges)

- Civil actions of not more than \$20,000
- Small claims
- Evictions
- Criminal misdemeanors punishable by fine only (no confinement)
- Magistrate functions


Municipal Courts¹ (953 Courts – 1,243 Judges²)

- Criminal misdemeanors punishable by fine only (no confinement)
- Exclusive original jurisdiction over municipal ordinance criminal cases³
- Limited civil jurisdiction
- Magistrate functions







September 2025 Judge Demographics







Highlights: FY 2024 Justice Courts

- After 13 years of decline, traffic and parking cases increased for a third consecutive year but were still at historically low levels.
- Fine-only misdemeanors cases involving juveniles or minors remained relatively consistent over the past 3 years while truancy cases increased during the same time.
 Tobacco and e-cigarette cases sharply declined in 2024.
- In 2024, new civil case filings rose at all court levels, reaching an all-time high.
 Municipal court filings increased by 17 percent, county court filings by 12 percent, and district court and justice court filings by 11 percent. Filings exceeded prepandemic levels in all but the county courts.
- Debt cases grew in all court types. Like the previous year, justice courts continued to
 experience the greatest increase with 20 percent more cases filed in 2024, reaching
 an all-time high. Debt cases also grew by 18 percent in county courts and 14 percent
 in district courts.
- Landlord/tenant cases broke the previous year's all-time high with nearly **310,000** new cases filed in the justice courts, a **3 percent increase** from the previous year.



Highlights: FY 2024 All Cases Filed


Of the more than 2.1 million cases filed in the justice courts, the majority were traffic-related misdemeanors.





Highlights: FY 2024 Criminal Cases


In 2024, the vast majority of the approximately 1.4 million criminal cases filed involved violations of state traffic laws.





Highlights: FY 2024 Traffic Cases


Dismissals and convictions each comprised 47 percent of all traffic cases disposed. Only 0.1 percent of cases resulted in an acquittal.





Highlights: FY 2024 Civil Cases

In 2024, debt claim cases accounted for almost 50 percent of all new civil case filings, followed by landlord/tenant related cases.

Civil Section

Counted and reported when



- A civil complaint or citation is filed (no matter how many parties are involved), or
- An original petition is filed (no matter how many parties are involved).

NOTE: At this time, the Civil Section of the report cannot adequately capture information on **truancy** cases.



Juvenile Section



Criminal cases filed that involve juveniles/minors

These cases are double counted on the report – once in criminal section and again in juvenile section



Includes cases filed involving truant conduct

Currently no place to count these other than in juvenile section



Additional Court Activity Section



Captures miscellaneous data including:

- Work performed by judge as magistrate
- Warrants and capiases pro fine issued



- Compliance with legal financial obligations (fines, court costs), including community service and jail credit
- Amounts collected (NOTE: totals may be different than what is reported to Comptroller)



Additional Court Activity Section


Total Fines, Court Costs and Other Amounts Collected:

- ➤ Line 20.A. Amounts retained by the County
 - ✓ Includes county portion of any fee divided by statute between county and State.
- Line 20.B. Amounts remitted to the State
 - ✓ Includes amounts that may eventually be retained or remitted to the county as service fees for compliance with reporting to the Comptroller.
- ➤ Line 20.C. Total amount of court-related money collected during the month
 - ✓ Must include the amounts reported on 20.A. and 20.B., and may include amounts sent directly to other entities, e.g., school districts, OmniBase, etc.
- OCA Justice Court Monthly Report Instructions provide detailed examples.



Data Highlight: FY 2024 Fines & Court Costs

Approximately \$280 million in fines and court costs were collected by justice courts in 2024, the majority of which was retained by the counties.

Look for Other Data Quality Issues



Manual errors

- > Typos, numbers entered in wrong line or column
- Information not entered into case management system correctly or at all



Case management system issues

- > System not properly set up (mapping or programming issues)
- Reports not programmed correctly
- > Updates from new release result in unintended data issues



Notice and Correct



Numbers that are

- Too low
- > Too high
- Do not accurately reflect your court's activity



Simple Steps for Quality Court Data



- 1. Report monthly.
- 2. Familiarize yourself with OCA reporting requirements to recognize potential data issues.
- 3. Utilize your case management system software to generate OCA reports and address data issues.
- 4. Produce the Court Activity Detail Report to monitor court data.





Public Safety Report System

- ➤ SB 6 (87th Tex. Leg., 2nd C.S.) mandated the reporting of additional new data elements, bail, and pretrial release information.
- > The reporting requirements were effective April 1, 2022.
- Government Code, Section 71.0351(a)(1)(A-C) requires the reporting of the number of defendants for each category of offense, the number of personal bonds, and the number of surety or cash bonds.
- This is information being captured from the Bail Form information submitted through the Public Safety Report System (PSRS).




Coming Soon - Court Analytics TX (CATX)

During the 88th Legislative Session, OCA Received funding to contract with a vendor to build a new statewide system to collect **Case-Level Data**. In September of 2024, a contract with OCA and Tyler Technologies was finalized to develop the system.








The purpose of this system is to design, implement, and maintain a robust statewide data warehouse and business intelligence system that will serve as a repository of court case level data for all court levels and case types across the State of Texas.




How It Works - Integrated

OCA is in the process of developing policy to guard PII (Personally Identifiable Information).



CATX System Development

- ☐ A standardized table of case filings, dispositions, statistical closures, events, etc. will be established to provide a tool for mapping and reporting your case data through CATX.
- ☐ Integration will provide the ability for CATX to securely connect to specific fields in your case management system and pull the necessary data directly from your system, without requiring any reports to be submitted on your end.
- ☐ The **end goal** is to eliminate the requirement for the clerk to submit manually or electronically the OCA Monthly Report, with additional reporting requirements reviewed and evaluated during later phases of the project to see if they can be eliminated.

To assist with "hands on" tasks by performing inventory and data clean-up efforts.

To perform as a liaison between judges, clerks, vendors, and court staff.


To guide the validation of case mappings and capturing data elements identified on the reports.

To help implement current and new reporting requirements and instructions.

- ☐ 11 positions with a dedicated representative for your area to contact
- **NOT** an auditing program, INSTEAD a solution-based program motivated to work as a team with the court, clerk, and staff
- Assists in bridging the gap with stakeholders to reach desired conclusions


