(NOTE: Calculating the filing fees in a delinquent tax case is not an empty exercise because often the filing fees are assessed as a court cost against an unsuccessful defendant.)

See §§ 35.002 and 35.003, Tex. Civ. Prac. & Rem. Code. Once filed, a foreign judgment has the same effect as a judgment issued by a Texas court. See § 35.003, Tex. Civ. Prac. & Rem. Code. A person filing a foreign judgment must pay the amount provided by law for filing the same or similar case in a Texas state court. See § 35.007, Tex. Civ. Prac. & Rem. Code.
