**ORDER DECLARING PLAINTIFF A VEXATIOUS LITIGANT
AND IMPOSING PREFILING ORDER**

On this day, the Court considered Defendant Matthew Rohmfeld's Motion to Declare Plaintiff a Vexatious Litigant and for Prefiling Order pursuant to Chapter 11 of the Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code.

After considering the pleadings, judicially noticeable court records, the arguments of the parties, and the applicable law, the Court makes the following findings and orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Plaintiff, Heather Neisen, has appeared in this matter pro se.
2. The present case was dismissed by this Court for lack of jurisdiction.
3. The present case constitutes an attempt to collaterally attack an Order entered in Cause No. 18-CV-1946, 16th Judicial District Court of Rutherford County, Tennessee.
4. Within the preceding seven (7) years, Plaintiff has filed eight (8) separate litigations in Nueces County, Texas, seeking to relitigate, invalidate, or otherwise collaterally attack the Tennessee order entered in Cause No. 18-CV-1946.
5. Each of those eight prior litigations filed in Nueces County was either dismissed by the court or non-suited by Plaintiff after adverse rulings or dispositive motions were filed.
6. Plaintiff's repeated filings constitute repeated attempts to relitigate matters previously determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.
7. There is no reasonable probability that Plaintiff would prevail in the present litigation.

8. Plaintiff's conduct has imposed unnecessary burden and expense upon Defendant and has burdened the judicial system.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED:

1. Vexatious Litigant Declaration

Plaintiff, Heather Neisen, is hereby declared a VEXATIOUS LITIGANT under Chapter 11 of the Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code.

2. Prefiling Order

Plaintiff is PROHIBITED from filing, pro se, any new litigation in any court in the State of Texas without first obtaining written permission from the appropriate local administrative judge as required by Tex. Civ. Prac. & Rem. Code § 11.101.

3. Clerk Notification

The Clerk of this Court is ORDERED to transmit a certified copy of this Order to the Office of Court Administration of Texas at:

and to take all necessary steps to cause Plaintiff's name to be placed on the statewide vexatious litigant list.

4. Finality

This Order constitutes a final, appealable order as to the vexatious litigant determination.

All relief not expressly granted herein is denied.
